Terms & Conditions for Purchase of Audit Tool for Organisational/Individual use

## **IMPORTANT – YOU MUST READ THESE CONDITIONS OF PURCHASE**

**If you cannot comply with these conditions you should immediately return the Audit Tool to the DSDC, unused, for a refund.**

1. The Tool forms part of a suite of materials produced by the Dementia Services Development Centre at the University of Stirling.
2. Purchase of the Tool constitutes the purchase of a non-exclusive licence by the organisation / individual ('User') to undertake an audit at a single site in conjunction with the accompanying workbook (part 2, version 1). Additional site audits will require the purchase of a separate licence by the User.
3. Undertaking an audit using this Tool does not constitute any form of endorsement of the building or surrounding environment by the Dementia Services Development Centre (DSDC) of the University of Stirling.
4. DSDC formal endorsement and certification can only be awarded to buildings and surrounding environments audited and certified by DSDC trained and registered design auditors.
5. For a period of three (3) years from the date of purchase of the Tool, and after completion of the audit, the User may state in publicity that they "have undertaken an audit by referring to and utilising dementia friendly design resource material produced by the Dementia Services Development Centre of the University of Stirling". No further assertions may be made in any publicity or published materials without the express consent in writing of the University of Stirling.
6. This licence for the use of the Tool is personal to the User and may not be re-sold. The User may not use the Tool to undertake a design audit service to third parties unless the User is licensed to do so by DSDC.
7. Up to three (3) photocopies may be made of the 'Part 1, Guidance Notes' section of the handbook and 'Part 2, Workbook' section of the Tool to assist the User in undertaking the audit. Permission to make further copies for internal use can be obtained by application to the DSDC.
